Nature of the task

Part 1

You are to write **your own imaginative text on** Relationships. Use any one of the media or forms you have studied as part of this unit, for example short story, poetry (including performance poetry), script for a short film.

The final imaginative text will be a maximum of 1000 words (or less for poetry by negotiation with teacher).

You should allocate appropriate time to plan and process your writing, and to consider how you can demonstrate your unique style as a writer.

Part 2

You are also required to submit a 250 word (maximum) **personal reflection on the nature and purpose of your imaginative text.** In your reflection, you will need to:

- explain how your reading and writing experiences in this unit influenced you when making decisions about writing your own imaginative text.
- justify your choices about appropriate and effective ways to represent the idea of Relationships
- reflect on and assess your learning experience throughout this process. (see attached notes)

Marking criteria

You will be assessed on how well you:

- represent your understanding of Relationships through effective use of your chosen form
- analyse and use language conventions and form to express complex ideas in a sustained imaginative composition
- use the process to communicate complex ideas
- reflect on and assess your learning and writing processes to identify strengths and areas for improvement.

Feedback provided

*You will be required to submit a draft of your writing to your teacher two weeks prior to the due date.

* The teacher will provide written feedback outlining strengths and areas for improvement to build on knowledge, understanding and skills for you to consider in your final draft.
