TASK:

A Trip down the Nile

Your task: Write a description of what you would see on a trip along the Nile River from your home in one city to a temple in another city.

Write your story as if you are an Egyptian living in ancient times. Use the pronouns "I", "my" and "me" and write in present tense – as if the story you are telling is happening as you write it e.g. "I push my skiff into the water and grab the oars."

Where do you get your information? Use your classwork completed so far and independent research to help write your story.

Your story is expected to be **500 words** in length.

Structure of your description

Paragraph 1 – Introduction [Aim for 100 words]

• Description about where you live and where you are going to travel to

Paragraph 2 – Body Paragraph 1 [Aim for 150 words]

• Description of the main features of the Nile River

Paragraph 3 – Body Paragraph 2 [Aim for 150 words]

• Describe the views, landmarks and people living along the Nile as you travel past

Paragraph 4 – Conclusion [Aim for 100 words]

• Describe your arrival at your chosen city, temple or pyramid

Do not plagiarise your work – you are to submit your own work.

Paragraph 1	 Introduction – write sentences to give information about the following: Where do you live? (city and part of Egypt] Where are you going? [city, temple, god you are going to visit] What are you travelling in? Which direction will you be travelling? Will you be going with or against the current? What is the weather like and how high is the river? what season are you travelling in? * These examples don't have to be in this order
Body Paragraphs 2	 Body paragraph – start with a topic sentence "as I travel, I admire the view around me." Describe the features of the Nile River as you travel past including the Blacklands and Redlands Use Historical terms relevant to your description of life along the Nile River
Paragraphs 3	 Body paragraph – start with a topic sentence "Further along my journey, I watch" Describe the Life of Ancient Egyptians living along the Nile River Use Historical terms relevant to your description of life along the Nile River
Conclusion Paragraph 4	 Conclusion paragraph – start with a topic sentence "I have finally arrived at" Describe the end of your journey Where have you arrived? Describe the temple, city or pyramid you have arrived at
